We have received notification from Forestry England that operations are taking place in one area on our route. staff spent 3 and half hours this week dealing with issues that have arisen through these platforms; we are sure you agree that any form of abuse or intimidation is not acceptable in any way so we are asking if parents could be extra vigilant in checking the use of these platforms and supporting children with this.

Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

Pre-school have had a fabulous week – gardening and using Class 1's "big bikes" – encouraging lots of team work and problem solving. We have created coronation crowns, leaf bunting and wavy royal sticks for the coronation party later.

Class 1 – This week Class 1 have continued their topic of Jaws, Paws and Claws and have been learning about the different animal groups. We have then furthered our learning, by identifying which animal group, our animals from our fact files belong to. In phonics we have continued to practise CCVC word blending, and our HFW's for this week are 'your, here & saw'.

Class 2 – This week, the Year 2's in Class 2 have completed their maths SATs papers. They have worked really hard on these and I am so proud of the progress they have made this year so far. They will be completing their reading papers during this month, with some children doing these next week. They have been very resilient so far and have all been trying their best to answer all of the questions - even when they were a bit tricky! As whole class, we have started to look at Florence Nightingale and explore who she was and why she was important. We found out that she was a very clever nurse who made hospitals better by ensuring they were clean. We are excited to continue this learning in the coming weeks.

Class 3 enjoyed exploring Roman artefacts in their history lesson on Wednesday. They guessed what time items might have been used for and used clues to make links to items we have today. In science, they explored different types of skeletons and categorised animals based on endoskeletons, exoskeletons and hydrostatics skeletons. They have amazed me this week in maths this week too. Y3 children had absolutely blown me away with their multiplication knowledge using the formal method and Y4s have all been confidently dividing numbers by 10 and 100 to find decimal answers. A huge well done Class 3 - you have amazed me this week!

Class 4 have been continuing to look at Midsummer night's dream in English this week. They have enjoyed writing their own play-scripts using a particular scene. This has also involved looking at Shakespearian language and finding modern day words to reflect the same meaning. Our current topic is Ancient Greece; they have found finding out about Greek civilisation and the events that occurred during this time very interesting. As part of this, the children have been tasting Greek food over the last few weeks and have now designed their packaging for it including recipe cards. There has been lots of excitement today for the King's Coronation and it has been lovely to see all the children in red, white and blue with their decorated crowns.

Free School Meal Scheme – May/June Half Term

For the May/June half term, Gloucestershire County Council (GCC) is providing vouchers to eligible families who have signed up to our Holiday Free School Meals (FSM) scheme. These vouchers are provided by GCC as part of our commitment to 'no child goes hungry'. The vouchers are funded through grant funding we have received and is separate to that of term time free school meals.

The scheme is for children in reception to year 11 who receive benefits-related free school meals and attend a school in Gloucestershire. Families who have signed up to the scheme or who are already registered will receive a total of £15 per child. (Article 24- the right to nutritious food)

Parents who have signed up previously do not need to re-register - you will already have been included. To ensure we reach all those who are eligible, we are encouraging parents that have not previously signed up, to sign up as soon as they can.

If you have any updates to an existing application, please email childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk so that we can update your details, as this is not an automatic process.

Applications for Holiday Free School Meal vouchers for the May/June half term are now open until midday 16 May. Voucher emails will be sent out on 22 May. Please check junk/spam email folders during this period as sometimes the vouchers end up there. If parents have not received their vouchers by the 23 May, please email childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk.
