Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

Pre-school – this week, Pre-School have been doing all things relating to the story 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea'. We have read the book every day and have watched the programme. The children have enjoyed using black stickers, string and wax crayons to give the tiger his stripes. We have used water colours to paint tea pots and traced over the tigers stripes developing our fine motor skills. We have also written invitations to the Tiger to come for tea and at the start of next week we are going to have a tea party before we start doing all things Christmas!

Class 1 – this week Class 1 have been looking at how to keep ourselves healthy. We discussed all the different ways to look after ourselves and then what effects exercise has on the human body. We have been writing super sentences in English, using adjectives to describe the Hare and Woolly Mammoth from Cave Baby.

Reception sounds (y, z, zz, qu) and HFW's (was, all, from, went, will, help). Reception maths- we have been looking at the composition of numbers 2 and 3 and how wholes are made up of different parts (1 is a part and another 1 is a part and the whole is 2).

Class 2 – this week, class 2 have been writing a fact file all about their own alien sock puppet. We have been writing questions and statements to describe the way our aliens look, move and what they eat. In Geography, they have been recalling physical and human features. They asked questions about why places are different and created their own seaside map. We have started practicing for our nativity this week too!

Class 3 - have been working really hard this week on play scripts. They have learnt about the features found in them and planned their own, which they have started to write today. We have been orally rehearsing the speech and I am impressed with the children's expression when acting as characters in their play. Thank you to the parents that attended the grammar session on Thursday after school, it was lovely to see you there. I was great to share a taster of how writing is taught in Class 3 and the content taught in each Year group. If you were unable to make it, packs with the slides and writing expectations have been sent home today.

Class 4 – this week, Class 4 have had a busy week of learning. In English, the children have been exploring the differences between the active and passive voice and how this can be used effectively in our writing.
