

A narrow slit in a castle arrow loop wall where arrows could be fired Part of the outer defence barbican of a castle, used to help defend the entrance to a castle battlements Found at the top of a castle's wall, with openings to shoot through and raised sections for protection drawbridge A bridge, which can be raised and lowered, often found over a castle's moat. A deep, wide ditch, moat surrounding a castle. Often filled with water. A tall, narrow building. tower portcullis A strong, heavy spiked




Where were castles built?


- near a source of water

- launch weapons to attack enemies




motte and bailey castle built from wood




barrier that can be lowered

to block an entrance.


stone keep motte and bailey castle
