

We are looking forward to the Sponsored Walk next month. As stated in the letter, this year we are walking one-way only and then finishing the school day at lunchtime. As part of our obligation and even though lunch-time is not included as part of the day, we have to offer those entitled to Free School Meals or Universal Free School Meals, a lunch on that day. Pre-school – The children have enjoyed sharing their Easter experiences with each other. We have hunted for worms, made our own envelopes and enjoyed lots of play in the sunshine. We have shared lots of stories involving different modes of transport, to introduce this term's theme – "I've got a ticket to ride".

Class 1 - we have had a brilliant first week back. We have started to blend more complex words now and have begun to revisit all of the wonderful sounds we have learnt since September. We have started to work towards the number 20 this week and the children have done very well in

remembering their teen numbers! We have settled in beautifully this week, with the children doing some fantastic independent writing about animals!! Amazing work from the children, showing me just how ready they are for the summer term

Class 2 - This week in Class 2 we have been settling back into being at school. We have started thinking about our topic of Important People and the children have all written a piece of writing about someone who is important to them. Many children wrote about their family and friends. This term we will be thinking about important people in history and how they have made improvements to the world we live in. This week we have started to read James and the Giant Peach as our class reader. The children all seem very excited to see what will happen in this book and were amazed and how big the peach has already gotten in a short space of time.

Class 3 - What an amazing week Class 3 have had! The children have been very engaged in their new topic- The Romans- this week. We visited Caerleon Roman Legion Museum on Wednesday and saw a Roman bath, amphitheatre, tried on armour in the barrack room, visited the museum gallery and took part in a soldier workshop. The children were very well behaved and the museum guides in the Roman baths complimented the class on their engagement with the artefacts and focus! They clearly learnt lots as they wrote amazing recounts Thursday. For pictures of the trip, log in into our class eschool page.

We have also enjoyed some time in the sunshine this week developing fielding and bowling skills in preparation for rounders games.

On Tuesday, the children were very excited to experience what a circus is like and were describing the sounds, sights and smells using popcorn and music.











Class 4 - This week, Class 4 have come back to lots of learning opportunities. The children have started to explore a fun Shakespeare comedy, A Midsummer Night's Dream, and the bother that the Athenians create in the magical woods. They are also investigating Living Things and their Habitats in Science and have so far explored what it is like to be a Taxonomist. The children have also started their swimming lessons and the staff that attended said their behaviour was great and they listened well in their lesson – I'm sure we are going to see some great progress this term for them. They have also been lucky enough to start to explore Greek cuisines and some were very brave this week, trying some new foods such as olives, feta cheese and hummus.

Curriculum at Steam Mills

In **Preschool**, the children's theme for this term is 'A Ticket to Ride..' and they will be learning all about the exciting ways you can travel around, in the local area and beyond!

In **Class 1**, the theme for the term is Jaws, Paws and Claws and the children are already using their learning from the trip to Cotswold Wildlife Park to help them.

Class 2 are learning all about Important People and what this means to them and what important people they have in their own lives.

In **Class 3**, the children are learning all about the Roman's and they have kicked off their learning with a fun trip to Caerleon this week – they really enjoyed this experience and now, this can support their learning going forwards.

Class 4 will be taking a trip back in time to learn about the Ancient Greeks – they have had a 'taste' of this with trying different foods – some foods were very popular and some certainly were not!
