Strike action by members of the National Education Union

I am writing to you about forthcoming strike action by the National Education Union (NEU), one of the main teaching trade unions. You will have seen coverage of this in the news, and I wish to inform you about the impact this is likely to have at our school.

Clearly this is a difficult situation; I would ask you, however, to be understanding. A national strike by teachers is very unusual. Taking strike action is not something that any teacher would undertake lightly. Those who wish to strike will have thought long and hard about their decision.

One of the key issues will be to assess whether there are sufficient staff available for the school to remain open, or partially open, during a strike. We will endeavour to give you as much notice as possible.

How will strike action affect our school?

At this point, it is likely that we will be open. If this changes, it may be at short notice so please check the website on the dates above, as any information about partial closure will be posted there.

Class Snippets

Pre-school – we have continued to look at snails and have recreated our own versions of Henry Matisse's famous art work "The Snail". The children have torn, cut and placed coloured paper to create their snails just like Matisse did! We have also used Numicon to look at number bonds of numbers up to 10, looking at the different ways we can create the same number.

Class 1 -this week, we have started the Fairy tale Jack and the Beanstalk and the children have been working very hard to write their own captions for the story. We have also been looking at what plants need to grow and stay alive and they have put together a very clear diagram. In Maths we have been looking at measuring length and have been discussing the different vocabulary we use to describe length (short, shorter, shortest, long, longer, longest). The children have been very engaged in this concept and have enjoyed measuring a variety of objects from around the classroom with cubes. In phonics this week, we have been working on the Black Cat 'or' sound and have been using this sound in our independent writing, which is fantastic! HFW's for this week are 'do', 'so', and 'it's'.

Class 2 – this week, we have been continuing with our science topic and have been looking at animals and their habitats. We recapped on our knowledge of which animals and plants live at the seaside and then continued to deepen our knowledge by thinking about lots of different habitats. The class did very well in their drawings of the animals. Ariana, in particular, produced a very beautiful piece of work! Hopefully we will keep building on this knowledge, in preparation for our trip to Cotswold Wildlife Park next term! We might even know more than the animal keepers.

Class 3 have had an incredibly busy week this week. We first had a reply from Zana Fraillion, the author of Wisp and she said how amazing the children's sequels to Idris's story were. We started a new book called 'Greta and the Giants' and have been focusing on complex sentences in writing.

In maths, Y3s have been comparing and ordering fractions and Y4s have been working on column subtraction, which they have amazed the adults with their knowledge! In music, we have been singing 'Blackbird' by 'The Beatles' and playing glockenspiels. The children also really enjoyed Frisbee golf with Mr Yearly in PE.

Class 4 - Class have enjoyed their Science lesson about light and how learning about how we see. They created models for how light travels in straight lines and reflects off objects to their eyes – they were particularly surprised to see how their pupils dilate in response to how much light is in the classroom. In Art, they have been practicing their still life drawing and learning about the impressionists and their style of painting, in particular, Monet. Play times have been good this week with team work, cooperation and listening skills.

Rights Respecting - Article of the Week

The Right to speak out (Article 13). Every child must be able to freely express their thoughts and opinions and be given access to all kinds of information, as long as it is within the law.

World Book Day – Thursday 2nd March

On World Book Day, children are invited to bring in an unwanted book from home and they will have the opportunity to swap it with another book provided by children. This was an idea put forward by the Student Council to improve sustainability, which links to the Rights Respecting articles about Climate Change. Please ensure books donated to the swap are in a 'swappable' condition and that it is a complete book, without any scribbles inside and the cover is attached. The theme of the day will be Bedtime Stories and children can come into school wearing their pyjamas! Please see attached poster.

Author Visit – Toadstool Tales

As part of our World Book Day celebration, we are very lucky to have a visit booked from our past Teacher, Mrs Taylor, who is now a multi-award winning Author. Mrs Taylor will be talking to the children on **Friday 3rd March** and signing/selling her books after school. Please attached poster.

Pupil Absence/Illness

The expectation when children are absent from school due to illness is that they rest and recuperate. The school is not able to provide work for children to complete during this time. If parents would like their children to do a little school work, you are welcome to encourage children to read and use the on-line platform already provided (eSchools).
