
World Book Day (Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents and personalities)

Strike action by members of the National Education Union

I am writing to you about forthcoming strike action by the National Education Union (NEU), one of the main teaching trade unions. You will have seen coverage of this in the news, and I wish to inform you about the impact this is likely to have at our school.

The strike days that are may affect schools in this area are:

- **Wednesday 15 March 2023**
- **Thursday 16 March 2023**

Clearly this is a difficult situation; I would ask you, however, to be understanding. A national strike by teachers is very unusual. Taking strike action is not something that any teacher would undertake lightly. Those who wish to strike will have thought long and hard about their decision. One of the key issues will be to assess whether there are sufficient staff available for the school to remain open, or partially open, during a strike. We will endeavour to give you as much notice as possible.

How will strike action affect our school?

At this point, it is likely that we will be open. If this changes, it may be at short notice so please check the website on the dates above, as any information about partial closure will be posted there.

Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

Pre-school children have been busy creating their coronation picture – choosing from using hands or pom-poms to paint or using crayons and coloured paper. They have also decorated a crown using a variety of sparkly resources. We have loved playing in the snow – experimenting with coloured water and pipettes.

Class 1 - we have had a busy week in Class 1 this week. We have been learning about King Charles and his coronation, and we have been doing our coronation pictures ready to go home next week. We have revisited measuring length and height, and have been measuring our classroom toys with cubes. The sound we have been learning this week is 'igh', with the HFW's of 'like, what, by, when, little'.

This week, **Class 2** have been working really hard in everything! They have been doing a few challenges in maths and reading and have been super stars in these! Always trying their best and working hard. We started reading our class book - The Journey Home- and the class are enjoying this a lot. The first character we met was a polar bear who was upset about his ice melting. We are very lucky that it snowed this week as we had the chance to go and collect some snow and think about why it melts. We also completed an experiment to see how long it takes a cup of snow to melt indoors. Some cups took 1 hour and others took 2 hours; we discussed why some cups would take longer and Class 2 decided if it had more snow in it, it would be slower to melt.

Class 3 writing - As part of our writing unit, class 3 children will be writing their own fairy tales. There is a competition called 'Cook up a fairy tale' through the British Library with the chance to win book tokens for your school. Children will all be writing fairy tales as their writing unit and we are hoping to enter these into the competition. See link. Class 4 have worked hard this week! They won class stars so a treat will be coming soon and they have done well to earn lots more since. It has been a busy week because of assessments and the children have tried very hard to achieve their best, all showing agency and respect towards their work. In Science, the children enjoyed learning about refraction and conducting two investigations – the illusions created by water surprised them! In art, they have been working to try and create colours they will be able to apply in their paintings. We also had some visitors into their Maths lesson today and they were AMAZED with children's work ethic and effort!

Charging Policy Review

The school has updated and reviewed the Charging Policy to bring both Woodside and Steam Mills Schools in alignment under the Federated Governing Body. This has resulted in a slight increase for some of our services here at Steam Mills which will help towards increased costs for Heating Oil, Electricity, Food and bought in Professional Services etc. There is a copy posted on the school website. Here is an overview of the main changes which take effect from **1st April 2023**:

Breakfast Club	from 7:45am	£4.00

After School Club	3:15pm-4:15pm	£4.00

4:15pm-5:30pm £5.00 (this is used
for care after other payable Clubs)
3:15pm-5:30pm £9.00

Late Fee: The schools have introduced a late fee for any parents/carers who are late collecting from ASC. The school will allow a few minutes buffer and has set the late fee at £2 for each completed 5 minutes over the collection time of 5:30pm. This fee will be added to the ParentPay account and is payable immediately.

Prostars Club 3:15pm-4:15pm £4.00

Day Visit/Trips Parent contribution is to be capped at £12.50 per pupil.

Nursery 3 year old unfunded or extra hours will be charged at £4.50 per hour.

Lunches £2.40 per meal. This charge remains the same from the increase in Sep 22.
