Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

Pre-School - another busy week at Pre-School! We took part in Maths fest along with the school. We looked at an artist called Piet Mondrian and used his famous piece of artwork to create our replicas using Lego, printing with rulers, colouring in a template and making our own stain glass windows. We have talked more about Autumn and the changes that happen within this season. The children have also enjoyed a range of role play, enjoying the last of the dry weather out on the school field and continuing to settle, making wonderful friendships within the setting. Our number of the week has been 3 and our sound has been T.

Class 1 – Busy week in Class 1. We have been learning lots about families and discussing what our families look like. The children have also drawn portraits of their families. In maths we have been doing some counting and looking at the concept of cardinality, which is all about 'how many'. We have been practising counting objects but also things we can hear such as claps and beats of a drum. In phonics we have learnt the 'i' and 'n' sound this week and our HFW's are 'in, it, is, I, am'. On Wednesday we had Maths Fest and Class 1 were looking at Piet Mondrian. For a lot of his work, he used primary colours and certain shapes to express how he was feeling. The children enjoyed their grownups from home coming in and doing the activities with them.

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Pre-school

Class 2 – this week, we have been innovating our own stories based on the class book, I Want My Hat Back. The children have been very enthusiastic about this text and have enjoyed role play and getting into character. We will be starting a new text next week. In phonics, the Year 2s have learnt the gn and wr sounds. The year 1s have recapped oi and been introduced to ay and oy. Thank you to everyone who came to Maths Fest on Wednesday; it was lovely to have parents in to see some of the artwork and help with painting in the morning!

Class 3 have had a brilliant week learning about Escher during Maths Fest. They explored a range of mathematical resources to create repeating patterns and tessellation, then they designed their own fish to tesselate in the style of Escher. The children had lots of fun tessellating leaves and sharing work with parents/ carers. On Tuesday, they amazed me with their fantastic swimming and in writing the children used inverted commas to show speech. For the Y3s this is the first time they have used this punctuation and the Y4s impressed me with using inverted commas, capital letters and punctuation inside speech.





Class 4 have had a really good week. The children have continued their work on Goodnight Mr Tom and how they can use DADWAVERS to improve their sentence openers, aiding cohesion and improving description. They also enjoyed their science lesson about voltage and using different voltages in a circuit and how this affects the component it is powering. In History, the children have started learning about the Battle of Britain and the impacts of war on civilians; there were some powerful messages in the clips from survivors in WW2. A HUGE THANKYOU to all of the parents that visited Class 4 for MathsFest - we hope you enjoyed your time with us and the children were very happy you left them some biscuits (:)

We observed many parents getting stuck in, and 'doing maths' (and smiling about it!) with painting, drawing, tessellating and measuring! ParentPay Instructions on How to Add Credit

A few parents have asked how they can ensure that their ParentPay accounts are always in credit. We have provided instructions below that explain the processes.

Adding credit to your Parent Account

1. Navigate to www.parentpay.com and log into your account 2. Select **Set up Parent Account** (If credit has been added to the Parent Account previously, this will read **Add Parent Account credit**)

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3. Select one of the pre-set amounts, or manually enter the amount in the Other amount box to top up with

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4. Choose how to pay by selecting **Other payment method**

5. A success notification will be displayed, and a receipt will be emailed to you

Making a payment using Parent Account credit

1. Navigate back to the homepage, and select one of the following:

a. Pay for <child's name=""> meals – located below the child's name in the pupil tiles in the centre of the page. This will only give the option to pay for school meals for a single child.

b. Pay for other items – located below the option to pay for meals in the pupil tiles in the centre of the page. This will only provide details of any items assigned this child.

c. Active payment items – on computers, this is located in the menu on the left side of the page. For mobile devices, this can be accessed by selecting 2. Select **View** against the item for payment

3. Enter the amount to pay, quantity required, or any other requested information

4. Select Pay by Parent Account

Please note: If there is not enough credit in your Parent Account to cover the cost of the item, you will be prompted to add the item to your basket

5. A success notification will be displayed at the top of the screen containing your updated Parent Account balance, and a receipt will be emailed to you.
