The NHS school vaccination team will be visiting on Wednesday


**9<sup>th</sup> October 2024**. Please find attached details of how to register your child, this is all being administered on-line this year, so there will not be any paper copies of forms going home.

**Class** 1 – Busy week in Class 1. The children have been working really hard on their name writing each morning. They have been using magic marbles to help with their pen grip and progress is being seen already. The children

have been provided with a name stencil in their book bags and it would be really helpful if they could practise this at home too. We have been doing lots of taking care of ourselves this week too. This week was our first PE and yoga sessions and the children worked really hard to change into their PE kits independently and their own shoes and socks. We have also been learning a new trick on how to put our coats on ourselves which the children are loving. We have now met all of the 10 monsters from Monster Phonics land. The children have shown the adults of Class 1 that they are more than ready to go full steam ahead starting next week (look out for sound sheets reading journals next week).

**Class 2** – this week Class 2 have been impressing with their role play skills. We have been using the book, I Want My Hat Back, as our writing text and the children got to pretend to be the characters in the story. In pairs they played the rabbit and bear. The sneaky rabbit had taken the bears hat and the bear was very angry. The whole class did fantastically in their role playing, and some of them were so inspired they continued this in their play time. The Year 2s have also been very engaged and focused in our maths lessons this week where we have been looking at the value of 2-digit numbers.

**Class 3** have worked really hard this week. They have impressed me with their understanding of 3 and 4-digit numbers in maths, using the dienes and place value charts to help them. In writing, they have written diaries as Heather from our book and they all worked incredibly hard to do this. We played the glockenspiels in music and talked about the value of musical notes. I am so I impressed with the children all trying their best!

**Class 4** - this week Class 4 have started looking at the book 'Goodnight Mister Tom' in English which is also linked to our topic of World War 2. We have been getting to know the characters in the book by looking at characterisation and considering how this period of time may have felt for a young child being evacuated. Continuing on this theme, Miss Barber has been looking at morse code in DT and the children also have found out about the wartime artist Kathe Kollwitz. This has involved looking at the artist background, her style of art and feelings that her art evoke.

# Accessing Breakfast Club and Afterschool Club

Please could parents/carers ensure that their child is booked into Breakfast Club and After School Club. There are booking forms available from reception and Miss Agg can also email these on request. For last minute requests we can take phone bookings and emails but these are obviously subject to availability. When dropping your child for Breakfast Club, please press the **Hall** button on the gate intercom, state your child's name, and staff will then let you in to walk your child around to the back door where there is another bell if needed. Like-wise when collecting, please press the Hall button and let staff know who you are and who you are collecting, they will then let you in to walk around to the back door to collect your child. On a Friday ASC is usually run from the small classroom at the front of the school, on this occasion, please press the button for the office. Thank you.

# School Debt Policy – September 2024

# Please ensure that your Breakfast Club and After School Club ParentPay accounts are in credit at all times.

Just to remind parents and inform new parents of our Debt Policy.

- Bookings will only be accepted if Breakfast Club and Afterschool Club Accounts are in credit for each day booked.
- If your child is a "no show" or you have not given 24hrs notice, you will be still be charged for your child's place.
- If your child is not booked in for either service, you will be contacted if we are oversubscribed, asked to collect your child.
- Accounts will be debited on the same day (BC) or next day (ASC) and not weekly.
- Childcare vouchers/tax free childcare payments should be **sent in advance** and your Parent Pay account will then be credited ready for use.
- Breakfast club remains free of charge to those eligible for income/benefits based Free School Meals.

# Free School Meal Holiday Vouchers

We would like to make you aware of changes to the holiday Free School Meal (FSM) voucher scheme that Gloucestershire County Council is currently offering to families in Gloucestershire. The holiday vouchers are designed to support eligible children in reception to year 11 who receive Pupil Premium (income-related) free school meals and attend a school in Gloucestershire, and families where no other support is available.

Gloucestershire County Council is committed to supporting families with 1 week of vouchers at £15 per child, per week for the October 2024 holiday. Applications for holiday FSM vouchers for October 2024 holiday will be open from midday 2 September 2024 until midday on 20 September 2024. We will be unable to accept any applications after this date. Vouchers will be distributed to families the week commencing 30 September 2024.

If parents do not receive their vouchers by 7 October 2024, please check their spam/junk mailboxes for an email from <u>selectcode@select-your-reward.co.uk</u>, as well as ensure mailbox settings allow junk mail.

For any parents wishing to update details of an existing application, please email <u>childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk</u> by 13 October 2024, so we can update their account, as details are not automatically updated.
