Breakfast Club/After School Club

Class Snippets

Pre-school – this week we have enjoyed exploring the school environment for signs of spring. The children have noticed differences over the week as flowers have gone from bud to bloom and there has been lots of lovely mathematical language talking about amounts and different sizes of plants and flowers. We have painted our own pictures of



daffodils by studying some real ones and also created fork printed tulips! We also had an amazing time creating music at the Forest school site with Rosie, trickling pine cones down bamboo canes, and creating different sounds in the environment. We also made a space ship and played Hide and Seek with our helper Mr Holder!!

Class 1 - in class this week we have continued looking at the story 'The Extraordinary Gardener' continuing to think about what makes us extraordinary and how we could write our own versions of the story. We have started to explore the Artic thinking about what it looks like and what we might find there, discussing what about the Artic is similar and different to the UK. We have also opened a new role play area in the class and have enjoyed being florists, which links in with our topic of gardening and plants. Our sound this week was 'air' and HFW (like, when, little, what, by).

Class 2 – this week, we have written an innovated story based on Lost and Found by Oliver Jeffers. The children created a story about an animal who turns up at a child's house. They chose their own animal and thought carefully about which habitat it needed to get back to. They chose a journey for their characters to take and then ended their stories by having the characters become friends. They wrote these stories by hand and then have been typing them to create digital stories on the iPads. Lots of great work was done this week.

Class 3 – this week, Class 3 have worked brilliantly in pairs to make a volcano model. They thought about the features of a volcano and use DT skills to build it. They will test them next week! In maths, the Y3 children have impressed me with their use of the formal multiplication method. The Y4 children have demonstrated perseverance skills with their short division method. In writing, the children have thought about character feeling and applied a range of sentence types to write a diary.

Class 4 had some lovely feedback from the staff at the swimming pool this week; they said the children listen well and that's why they always get extra play time every week, which was lovely to hear. The children have considered how to use antonyms to create contrasting settings/atmospheres in their writing this week and they have tried hard to include a range of features. In Geography, they were able to create an experiment to see how erosion and deposition affects rivers and they drew some lovely diagrams to show what they did. Yesterday, the children started looking into the Linnean Classification system and they were using observable characteristics to sort animals - they found this tricky but came up with some good ideas about how they could group animals based on what they could see. They have started their DT unit this week and will be using tie-dye and materials for effect - watch this space!

Houses of Parliament Federation Trip

As part of our Rights Respecting, we have been fortunate enough to secure a booking to the Palace of Westminster, 10th June 2025. The children that are on the school councils have been invited as they have shown a keen interest and passion to make changes at our



schools, however, each school will have an allocation of extra spaces and we would like to offer more children the opportunity to attend. These should be children that a) have previously been on the school council, b) put themselves forwards as candidates for the school council previously, or c) have a known interest in politics. The trip is heavily subsidised but there would be a small contribution required of £12 for this trip. If your child is in receipt of free school meals, there may be funding available to subsidise further.

If you wish for your child to be considered, please communicate with your school office directly by Friday 28th March. We will then put your child's name in a ballot and then communicate if you have been successful or not, before the Easter Holidays.

Free School Meals – Easter Holidays

Applications for holiday FSM vouchers for the Spring (Easter) Holidays 2025 will be open from midday 18 March until midday on 1 April. Voucher emails will be sent from week commencing 7 April.



Please check junk/spam folders during this period as sometimes the vouchers end up there.

If parents have not received their vouchers by 14 April, please encourage them to submit a query via the Microsoft Form HERE

This Spring (Easter), Gloucestershire County Council will provide families in receipt of Free School Meals, who sign up to this offer, with vouchers to assist with food costs during the school holidays. The vouchers are funded through grant funding we have received, and they are separate to that of term time free school meals.

The scheme is for children in reception to year 11 who receive Pupil Premium (benefits-related) free school meals and attend a school in Gloucestershire. Families who have signed up to the scheme or who are already registered will receive a total of £15 per child. To find out more about the scheme and to apply, parents can visit our FAQs | Gloucestershire County Council

Families who have signed up previously do not need to re-register for Spring (Easter) 2025 holiday vouchers - they will already have been included. Families that have previously signed up will need to contact us with any changes to their circumstances (e.g. if the number of children eligible increases or decreases). To ensure we reach all those who are eligible, we are encouraging parents that have not previously signed up, to sign up as soon as they can.

Using vouchers – vouchers need to be used will only be awarded once the parent has registered for the scheme and cannot be backdated. Vouchers are valid for 6 months, although should be used in the holiday period in which they are awarded. If vouchers are not claimed and have expired, they cannot

be re-issued. Vouchers not received should be queried via the Microsoft Form <u>HERE</u> by the end of the holiday period. For any parents wishing to update details of an existing application, please submit an update existing details request via the Microsoft Form <u>HERE</u> so we can update details

Parent/Carer Checklist

It would be helpful if Parents/Carers could run through a daily checklist before school, to ensure that your child/ren are ready for the school day. This would reduce the amount of phone calls home the school has to make and also reduce anxieties for your child/ren.
