Strike action by members of the National Education Union

I am writing again to you about forthcoming strike action by the National Education Union (NEU), one of the main teaching trade unions. You will have seen coverage of this in the news, and I wish to inform you about the impact at our school.

Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

Pre-school – this week we have read lots of rhyming stories, looking at different modes of transport including, "The Bear in the Balloon, A Lark in the Ark and Duck in the Truck". We have made colourful tracks – driving cars in paint and introduced Dough disco to our new friends.

Class 1 – This week Class 1 have continued their hard work on CCVC words and we have been doing lots of tricky word practise. We have then been applying this phonics knowledge in our independent writing, as we continue our animal fact files, we started last week. This week, was the first proper week of forest school, with Pre-school joining us. Reception set a great example to their younger peers and demonstrated beautifully the rules of forest school.

Class 2 – This week we have started our history topic. The children in Class 2 had to do some investigation of artefacts to discover what we are going to be learning this term in history. They went around the room and looked carefully at the different objects which were around for them. There were some old medicine bottles, a first aid book, some nurses' uniforms and some pictures of paintings from the past. The children thought very hard and decided that we are learning about nurses and hospitals. I explained to them that we would be finding out some more about two very important nurses from the past; Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. They are very excited to learn some more about these significant individuals from history.

Class 3 had an amazing art day on Wednesday. They explored the work of the Romans and how they used tesserae to construct mosaics on the floors and walls of Roman villas. They compared their work to the work of a modern architect that used smashed pottery-Gaudi. Children made very insightful comments about the different mosaics.

A huge thank you to FOSM for funding a welcome sign mosaic activity for the children make to go at the front of the school. The children really enjoyed making a mosaic collaboratively as a class to share with the rest of the school. They learnt how to cut mosaic tiles into different shapes and arrange them to make a design.

Class 4 - have been busy this week – Year 6 are working hard towards their end of Key Stage 2 Assessments and the Years 5s are being very respectful of this. The class have impressed the teachers, including Mr Bird, who will be providing supply for the school whilst teachers monitor their subjects. Mr Bird is also a school governor and he was very impressed with the children in C4 and commented on their great learning behaviours... The children got to celebrate a consecutive win with class stars this week and they are doing well in working towards a class treat to support this.

Thank you to FOSM, who will be funding the KS2 Performance. Class 4 are already looking forward to what this might be – scripts will be handed out after the SATs. Just a reminder, Y6s are welcome to come in early during SATs week to get settled and go over revision for the tests on that day. All Y6 children MUST attend these SATs; they are statutory and inform next steps for Secondary school. If you have an issue around this, please contact the school office.
