Industrial Action

Following on from yesterday, the school would like to reiterate that this was a non school day for classes 1-4 due to a National Industrial Action day by teachers. As such, there was no expectation for teachers to set work for the children.

Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

Pre-school – The children have created "flower" gifts and tags for their Mums. We have talked about the special Mummies, Nannies and Grandma's in our lives. The children have been recycling wrappers from their lunch boxes, taking "Michael Recycle" to lunch every day.

Class 1 - This week the children have been learning the trigraph sound 'air', along-side practising tricky words (like, what, when, by, and little). This week in maths we have been focussing on composition and have been investigating what two numbers go together to make 7 (5 and 2). This week, is Science Week! We have been observing our seeds/bean plants and we have also been

water, glitter, food colouring and oil together.

In Class 2 this week we have been doing some super writing! We have been using our inference skills to think carefully about

the vocabulary that is in our class book and tried to decide

making predictions on what would happen if we were to mix

what the characters may be thinking. We have also created posters that try and explain to elephant hunters why hunting is not the right thing to do. Lots of children were able use language which relates to rights respecting. We have all been getting very excited for our trip to Cotswold Wildlife Park and thinking about which animals we would like to see at the park!

Class 3 - Class 3 had an exciting week exploring how to make volcanic eruptions. They learnt that combining vinegar and bicarb will create a fizz and many said they will add red food colouring to make lava. Next week, they will be designing and making their model volcano, ready to test the following week. They have amazed me with their writing this week - in English they wrote recipes, focusing on adverbs and fronted adverbials. In geography, they wrote travel leaflets to explain what Iceland is like as a country. Ask them about why Iceland is so volcanic!

Class 4 - British Science Week. Class 4 have enjoyed their light unit and this week, we delved a bit deeper due to it being Science Week. We used prisms to refract white light so we could expose the visible spectrum - the children thoroughly enjoyed this experiment. The children got to experiment with different shaped prisms to see if this impacted the outcome and different materials for the prisms - glass or plastic. We also discussed the theme of 'connections' for Science Week and how Science links to our Key Drivers: Aspiration, Communication and Knowledge of the World. The children are also making good progress with their Monet artwork, with colour mixing and technique -Miss Barber is pleased with the autonomy and agency most of the children have shown towards their work.
