Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

Pre-School – we hope you all had a lovely week off for the half term break! We have had a very busy week back, engaging in lots of firework talk and arts and crafts and touching on why we may be seeing people wearing poppies. We have created firework pictures by rolling marbles in paint, using bright and colourful dabbers, using the ends of tubes cut up to create a firework effect and flicking elastic bands covered in paint. We have touched on <u>Remembrance</u> Day and why we may see people wearing the poppy flower around us. We have had music with Rosie where we met Katy the Kantele and Heather has been in towards the end of the week completing some work experience with us. We have also been creating large train tracks, roleplaying with small figures, bikes and scooters (when it's been dry!) and lots more fun!

Class 1 – this week the children have been learning about Guy Fawkes, and thoroughly enjoyed acting out the gun powder plot. They have also enjoyed learning about Remembrance Day and have been writing letters to fallen soldiers. Sounds this week are f,ff,l,ll,ss and HFW's are 'he, she, me, we, be, of'.

Class 2 - this week we have begun our history unit on the Great Fire of London. So far, we have learnt that in 1666 there was a very big fire in London. We have discussed what the houses were made of at that time and how the fire started. The children role played what they could do to get someone's attention if there was a fire. The year 1s have learnt the ea (ee) and ea (silent a) sounds in phonics and the year 2s have learnt y(i) and al sounds. In maths, both year groups have begun a unit on addition.

Class 3 have had a great 1st week back. They have been reading a new book in Guided Reading called The Carnival of Animals: poetry collection and performed poems based on different animals. They thought carefully about how to use their voices/sound effects to portray the animal. In maths, they have all moved onto multiplication and division, been working hard to use bar models to divide, and number lines to count in 3s and 4s for the Y3s, and 6s and 9s for the Y4s. Please remember to use TTRocks at home to rehearse times table facts. We have had a busy week selling poppies and I am impressed with the children's maturity when supporting peers to buy their merchandise.

Class 4 have had a lovely first week back - the children have been celebrated this week via pebbles, silvers or class stars for their efforts and learning attitudes. We have kicked off November non-fiction month with a special box of books and three children are selected daily to choose one to take home, which they have been very excited about. In Science, we have started to learn more about forces and the children were very engaged in this and in History this week, they were secret agents and had to crack a code with a Caesar Cipher; this was in readiness for their trip to Bletchley Park next week, which they are very excited about.
