Phonics Workshop

This is a chance for you to learn about how the school delivers its Phonics sessions and how you can support your children with their Phonics work.

Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

Pre-school – this week we have been continuing our autumnal theme at Pre-School. We have made bushy squirrel tails using leaves and other natural resources and hand print trees. We have been talking about our families, who lives in our house and if we have any pets. The children have been continuing to develop their fine motor skills and independence by putting on and taking off dressing up clothes by themselves.

Class 1 - this week Reception have been looking at the numbers 3 and 4, then applying their mathematical thinking into making groups of objects. In phonics we have been revisiting our previous sounds and our sounds of the week are (m, d, g) and HFW's are (dad, and, am). As a whole class we have been using Owl Babies as a focus text, working on our comprehension and sequencing, with Year 1 independently writing captions for the story. Our foundation focus has been the history of Steam Mills Primary and we are now moving onto 'where we live'.

Class 2 – on Tuesday afternoon, the children from Class 2 visited Woodside School. We had a nice afternoon there, listening to harvest songs and making harvest wreaths. Class 2 were very well behaved and represented Steam Mills incredibly well. It was a bit of a squeeze at Woodside with 75

children, however, they all seemed to enjoy their time mixing with the other children from Woodside and Soudley schools. This week in maths, both year groups have begun a unit on 2D shapes. The Year 2's have been learning about pentagons, hexagons and octagons and they have been showing their fantastic knowledge.

Class 3 had an exciting week learning all about Ancient Egypt with our workshop on Wednesday. We were visited by a scribe, who time travelled from Ancient Egypt. We watched how to mummify a pharaoh, built our own cities thinking about the resources we needed, wrote on papyrus paper and asked lots of questions to our visitor. The children had a brilliant time!

The children have also worked well this week for lots of different adults and adapted well to this.







Class 4 have had busy week – the children have been working on their plans ready to write their memoirs for their chosen characters. They really enjoyed seeing parts of the book, Hidden Figures, come to life by watching sections of the film and this really helped them understand how they could describe emotions, facial expressions and body language – hopefully we will see this all come to fruition next week in their work. We now have enough parent volunteers for our trip later this month so thank you to those parents that have agreed to spend the day with us © Please remember to give your child consent for the trip via parent pay or they will not be able to come with us and will remain in Class 3 for the day.

Childrensfund – Half-term Free School Meals

We would like to make you aware of the holiday Free School Meal (FSM) voucher scheme that Gloucestershire County Council is currently offering to families in Gloucestershire.

Applications for holiday FSM vouchers for October half term are open from midday 03 October until **midday 17 October**. Voucher emails will be sent out on 23 October. Please check junk/spam folders during this period as sometimes the vouchers end up there.

If parents have not received their vouchers by 25 October, email childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk.

Families who have signed up to the scheme or who are already registered will receive a total of £15 per child. To find out more about the scheme and to apply, parents can visit our Holiday FSM Vouchers webpage.

Parents who have signed up previously do not need to re-register, they will already have been included. To ensure we reach all those who are eligible, we are encouraging parents that have not previously signed up, to sign up as soon as they can. If you feel you may be eligible for Free School Meals and have not applied, you can apply here - apply for free school meals

Using vouchers – vouchers will only be awarded once the parent has registered for the scheme and cannot be backdated. Vouchers are valid for 6 months, although should be used in the holiday period in which they are awarded. If vouchers are not claimed and have expired, they cannot be

re-issued. Vouchers not received should be queried via email to childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk by the end of the holiday period.

For any parents wishing to update details of an existing application, please email childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk so we can update their account, as details are not automatically updated.
