Pre-School - have enjoyed the dry, warmer weather this week. We have been playing on our new scooters, water channelling and having a good run around on the school field. Our story this week has been 'We're going on a bear hunt' and the children have been engaging in role play, small world play in the tuff tray and recalling the story. We have also made a giant train track inside, water painting and chalk writing. Our number this week has been 7 and our sound has been A.

Class 1 – this week, we have been looking more at castles, including the function of different castles and who would have lived there. In science we continued our learning about materials, we sorted them into groups and went to find different objects made of those materials. In English we have been

writing facts about cats to go into a leaflet we are making. Reception have also been looking at 3D shapes in addition to their mastery of number.

Reception phonics this week is CCVC words (i.e., stop, step, swim, from, clap). This can be really challenging for the children as the consonant's blends can be hard to hear. The children are working really hard with this skill.

Class 2 – This week we have been thinking about how plants grow. We have thought carefully about how sunflowers grow and how oak trees grow. In science, we have been exploring the parts of a flowering plant. To do this, we created our own flowers from different materials and labelled the parts. Some of the year 2's then thought carefully about the functions of the plants. We have also looked at the importance of roots in trees this week. I just wanted to add what a fantastic week we have had and how fantastic the whole class were at swimming again! They are super stars!







Skills for Learning, Learning for Life



Class 3 enjoyed rounders outside this week, as it was finally dry! We worked on batting skills. I was amazed by how far some of the children could hit the ball! We had a brilliant time at Beechenhurst yesterday being Trainee Foresters to measure the height of trees by walking away from them and looking between our legs, explored why some are cut down by looking for diseases and hunted for different bugs. The children enjoyed being out in the fresh air and Vicky from the Forestry complimented them on their ability to ask questions about the topic.



Class 4 have been working hard this week. In Science, we have been looking at the evolutionary stages of humans and the scientific evidence that supports this. The Y6's were able to use some of their learning about the Linnaean Classification System to support some of Darwin's ideas and they were able to compare skeletons to modern-day humans. The children were able to use some of their map skills this week in history, to locate modern day Central America and plot where the Ancient Maya lived thousands of years ago. On Tuesday, 6 teachers from different schools, Mrs Oliver from Woodside and the GLOW Hub Maths Lead came in to watch C4's maths lesson and the teachers were very impressed with the children's knowledge and behaviour – they represented the school values amazingly which made us very proud. There has been some Residential information sent out this week so please make sure this is returned to school as soon as possible.
