**Pre-school** – Pre-school are still at the “Seaside”! We have created ice-cream paintings, added sticker “scoops” to numbered ice-creams and engaged in lots of holiday role play. The children have also been performing lots of shows on the stage, exploring a wide variety of musical instruments and complete with some interval snacks!

We have also been discussing our independence and things we are learning to do or will learn to do independently, such as swimming. The children were a credit to the school and were very well behaved. Many of us touched a starfish which was very brave and exciting. It felt a lot tougher than we were expecting it to. The children also were excited to see penguins and the other sea creatures. It was a lovely day for us all; thank you to the parents who volunteered to come with us - we couldn't have done it without you! On Thursday, Mrs Evans spent the morning doing art and RE with the children. They all made beautiful art pieces based on the creation story. ### **School Hours**

To bring the school into line with current Government guidance, the school start time will be changing from September 2023. Children will be welcome to come into the school grounds from 8:40am and will need to be ready to go into their classrooms at **8:45am**. Pick-up time will still be 3:15pm. Pre-school start time remains unchanged at **9:00am** and pick-up is 3:00pm.

### **School Lunches**

Unfortunately the paid school meal price will be increasing again in **September to £2.54 per meal**. This increase is as a result of current food and energy costs. We have been able to minimise this increase with AiP so that it falls in-line with the current Gloucestershire County Schools price.

### **School Debt Policy – September 2023**

New measures we are introducing from September are as follows.

- Bookings will only be accepted if Breakfast Club and Afterschool Club Accounts are in credit for each day booked.
- If your child is a “no show” or you have not given 24hrs notice, you will be still be charged for your child's place.
- If your child is not booked in for either service, you will be contacted and if we are oversubscribed, asked to collect your child.
- Accounts will be debited on the same day (BC) or next day (ASC) and not weekly.
- Childcare vouchers/tax free childcare payments should be **sent in advance** and your Parentpay account will then be credited ready for use.
- Breakfast club remains free of charge to those eligible for income/benefits based Free School Meals.

**Updated regular booking forms will be sent home next week for regular users of the Breakfast Club and After School Club. Please could these be completed and returned before the end of the school year, where possible please, to reserve your places for September?**

### **FSM Summer Holiday Scheme & HAF Scheme**

Families who have signed up to the scheme or who are already registered will receive 2 weeks of vouchers for the summer holiday at £15 per child per week. For the remaining 4 weeks of this holiday period, the HAF programme provides a meal for children attending the activities they are booked onto.
