Forestry England have confirmed there is a grace period for parking charges of 10 minutes, if you are going to be longer when collecting your child from The Glade area, charges will apply and just to warn you there is now camera identification systems at the site.

Pre-School – What a lovely sunny week at Pre-School. We have been making the most of the sunshine outside playing in out sand pit, mud kitchen, builders' yard and on the bikes and scooters. We have been talking about plants and how to grow and care for them and next week we are going to plant our own seeds. We have also done painting inside and outside, large scale drawing, tea parties and train track building.

Our number this week has been 10 and our sound had been T.

Class 1 – short but sweet week for Class 1. We have been writing instructions for children who will be starting school in September and have been writing advice to the character of our story. In phonics, Reception have been reading a story of The Little Hen as a group and our HFW's are 'time, out, house, about'. In Maths we have been making number tracks using the carpet tiles and collectively we made one all the way to 24.

All of the children had a wonderful time on our trip Wednesday. They all demonstrated how sensible they could be and they all used their listening ears for the whole day, showing the other guests of Goodrich

Castle and Beechenhurst how wonderful they are. We had a great time exploring the castle, looking for the different features, and we even explored the dark dungeon. A couple of Year1 's were super brave and also climbed their way to the Keep.





Class 2 – this week has been soooooo busy in Class 2! On Tuesday we spent the morning thinking about what land features were near Goodrich Castle and why the castle would have been built in Goodrich. The children noticed a river, hill and a forest near it and made some wonderful suggestions as to why this place was chosen. On Wednesday we had a fantastic day at Goodrich Castle and Beechenhurst. In the morning, we explored the whole of the castle and many of us climbed to the top of the keep. In the afternoon, the children had a well-earned play at Beechenhurst and then we became trainee woodland artists. We explored colour, texture and shape with natural materials; the children created some beautiful final pieces of work too! Thank you so much to all the volunteers who supported our trip, we could not have done it without you! On Thursday morning, the children wrote a recount of their trip to Goodrich for the end of our history topic.



Class 3 - have had a brilliant week. They have been observing their plants to see which ones are growing well. We have noticed that some have started to go crispy and droop. In maths Y3 children have moved onto fractions are working very well using bar models to show parts of the whole. Y4 children have amazed me with their understanding of comparing and ordering decimals with 2 decimal places. The sun was shining on Tuesday, when we did rounders and the children did some amazing batting and fielding. Please remember sun-cream/hats in the sunnier weather, as we will be outside.

Class 4 - what a lovely sunny week we have had! Class 4 have enjoyed the good weather with their yoga lesson yesterday being outside and Miss Barber took them outside during English to role play and freeze frame their prequel/sequel ideas. Science lessons this week have been about testing insulators and conductors of heat. This experiment was very interesting for the children and they have been excited to share their new knowledge.

The year 6's have been working hard on the lead up to SATs, we are very proud of them and wish them lots of luck next week! You've got this! 🙂
