Class Snippets

Pre-school - since the start of term, the children have been looking at recycling and ways we can help in our environment. We have read books; Litterbug Doug and There's an Elephant in my kitchen to inspire and prompt the children's experiences, thoughts and ideas. Every day we are taking our story's superhero Michael Recycle



to lunch, to collect rubbish from our lunchboxes. The warm weather this week has allowed us to enjoy lots of lovely play outdoors, the school field and climbing equipment.

Class 1 - this week we have been very busy. We have enjoyed our second gymnastic session, learnt all about the life cycle of a bean plant and thought about what we can do that makes us extraordinary. For world book day we enjoyed many stories and exploring rhyming words in a poetry workshop. In phonics our sound this week was 'igh' and our HFW (like, little).

Class 2 - we have had such a lovely week this week! The children are really enjoying our writing unit -Lost and Found. They worked hard this week to create some similes to describe a wave. We had some beautiful ones - as huge as a mountain, as transparent as a window, as dark as the night moon! We enjoyed some pancakes on Tuesday and read Mr Wolf's Pancakes from our book vote. The year 1s have finished learning all the new phonics sounds so will now just be recapping for the rest of the year! Class 2 have also been enjoying some measuring over the past two weeks. We have been using CM to measure the length and height of objects, with the year 2s beginning to use metres too!

Class 3 - this week, Class 3 have had a busy week working on multiplication and division in maths. We have also looked at TTRocks to remind children about this great resource to develop multiplication fluency. In writing, the children are excited about reading our new book 'Leon and the Place Between' and have used their senses to describe a circus. We were very lucky to have a poetry workshop for World Book Day and the children enjoyed listening to a bedtime story about the magic of reading. The children are really looking forward to making volcanoes next week in DT and have been busy designing them today.

Class 4 - have had a busy week. Additionally, we have started our new Science topic this week - Living Things and their Habitats - and the children recalled some of their prior learning to help them. They thoroughly enjoyed World Book Day and were excited to unwrap the book parcels they swapped.

Houses of Parliament Federation Trip

As part of our Rights Respecting, we have been fortunate enough to secure a booking to the Palace of Westminster, 10th June 2025. The children that are on the school councils have been invited as they have shown a keen interest and passion to make changes at

our schools, however, each school will have an allocation of extra spaces and we would like to offer more children the opportunity to attend. These should be children that a) have previously been on the school council, b) put themselves forwards as candidates for the school council previously, or c) have a known interest in politics. The trip is heavily subsidised but there would be a small contribution required of $\pounds 12$ for this trip. If your child is in receipt of free school meals, there may be funding available to subsidise further.

If you wish for your child to be considered, please communicate with your school office directly by Friday 28th March. We will then put your child's name in a ballot and then communicate if you have been successful or not, before the Easter Holidays.

Parent/Carer Checklist
