Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

**Pre-school** – this week the children have enjoyed lots of water play in many forms; using bamboo and plastic channelling, small scoops and mastering the small syringes; exploring cause and effect and problem solving when challenges occur. The children have extended their own play with lots of their own ideas; making a stage and kitchen from milk crates and exploring paint, making icecream handprint pictures and sandcastles using a variety of textured collage.

**Class 1** – this week we have been looking closely at The Rainbow Fish and writing a book review. In maths we have been practising our number bonds of 10, the children will be bringing home a number bond rainbow to display as a reminder of their number bonds over the summer. In Geography we have been continuing our learning of coasts, and this week we were looking at

water defences on the coasts and we experimented with water and glitter to make a class water defence. High frequency words for reception are- Mr, Mrs, don't, people, could

**Class 2 –** this week we have started a new book in English, Last Stop on Market Street. The children created and performed some poetry, they have used adjectives to describe and created questions. They have really enjoyed looking at the bright illustrations the book has. We have finished our reading comprehension unit based on The Magic Finger and watched a lovely stage show of this book online. In PSHE we have thought about the importance of hygiene routines and helped Harold sequence his morning routine.

Class 3 - had a busy week at gymnastics. They tried the trampolines and a high beam. They enjoyed jumping into the foam pit and lots of children found their 'brave' when trying this new equipment. In DT, we have designed and planned out mines to make next week. The children have thought carefully about the materials they will use and have remembered very well the features that they saw in the coal mine. We are looking forward to making them next week. In writing, we have planned a report all about tea and will be writing these next week.

**Class 4** – as mentioned above, Class 4 children have attended their residential trip this week and arrived back at school today. The few children from the class that were in school had a very busy time working across the school, helping teachers as well as completing tasks relating to their learning and topic work.
